

- Ethics and privacy should be addressed in each proposal



ESRIF: European Security Research and Innovation Forum



Strategy group, set up by its stakeholders together.

- demand side supply side civil society side
- 70 high level members nominated by EU Member States • 9 Associated Countries • European organisations (e.g. EC)
- Mid and long term Joint Security Research Agenda
- Link security research with security policy making
- Provide guidance to the Member States (national security programmes) and to European security research
- Public-private dialogue in the field of security research
